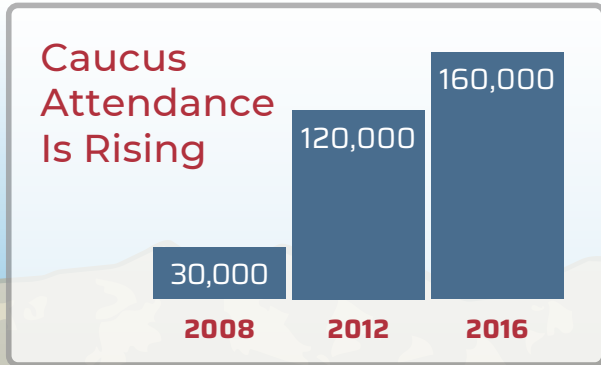
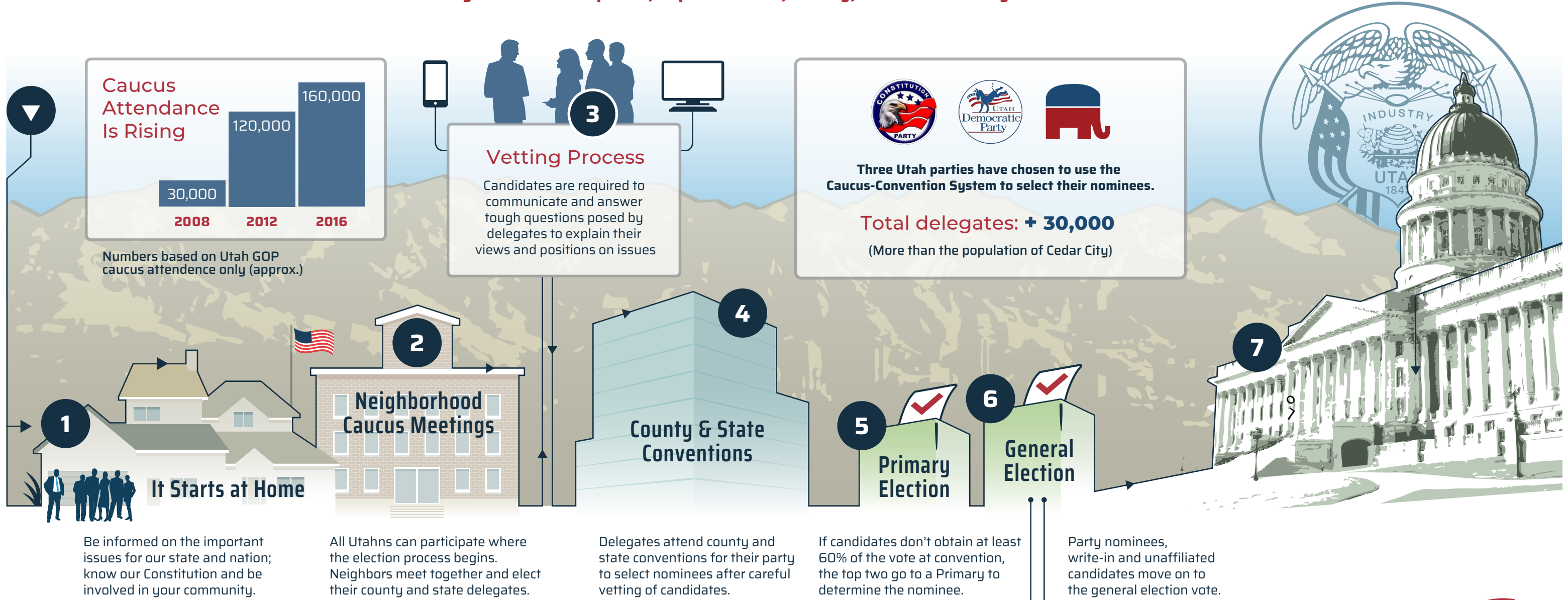


UTAH'S CAUCUS-CONVENTION SYSTEM

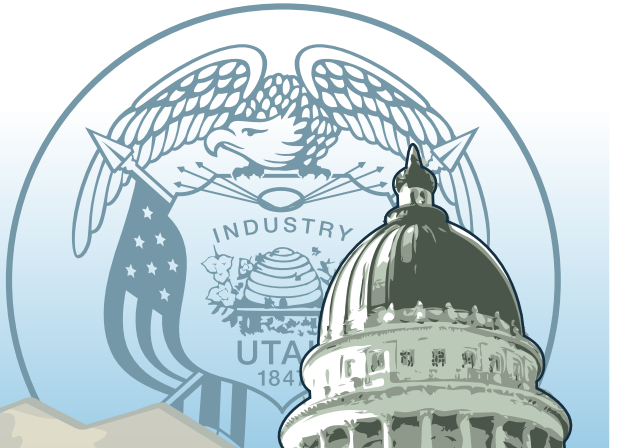
America's Best Election System for Participation, Representation, Vetting, and Accountability

Three Utah parties have chosen to use the Caucus-Convention System to select their nominees.

Total delegates: + 30,000
(More than the population of Cedar City)



DELEGATE -
An unpaid volunteer, elected by Utahns at neighborhood caucus meetings who represent the views and concerns of their local community. Delegates serve for two years and are charged with studying the issues and researching the candidates running for office within their political party. This process is known as "vetting" wherein delegates are tasked to find the most qualified candidates for their party's nomination only. Delegates also debate, discuss and vote on resolutions, platform planks, amendments to party governing constitution and bylaws, as well as voting for party leaders.

- S Signature Candidate**
Unaffiliated or Independent Candidates can get on the general ballot via signatures
- W Write-in Candidate**
Voters may 'write in' any candidate they choose which isn't on the ballot

The role of a delegate cycles through each election year to keep elected representatives accountable, and government more transparent.
